



That would be Dallas.

First, there was Mike Dallas, an infielder-pitcher who starred for the Owls from 1987-89. Then, it was Brian Dallas, a standout at third and short from '90-92 who helped West Lawn to a league championship, two state regional berths and one state tourney ance.

mese days, Steve Dallas, the youngest of the brother trio, is a stalwart at short for the Owls (8-1 South, 16-7 overall). And, he's following quite precisely in the footsteps of his accomplished sibl-

"Steve definitely fits the mold of the other two," Matz said. "None of them have ever been much for noisemaking, but they've all been so fundamentally sound. They just go out and do their thing,

"I think I'm kind of a mix of both Mike and Brian," Steve said. "I'm not as good a fielder as Mike was and don't have the arm Brian had, but I think I kind of fall in

between."

Steve, a slick-fielding 17-yearold who hits out of the two-hole. headed into the week hitting .435 (27-for-62) with one homer, six-doubles, 17 RBIs, 18 runs and 13 steals.

"I've been doing that ever since I can remember," Steve said. "I was drug along to all the games, too. And that really helped, as far as mental tough-


That mental toughness has no doubt helped Dallas both on the baseball diamond and on the basketball court, where he was an All-Berks selection at guard for Wilson last winter.
